## The story of ${ m John}...$

- Six years ago, John was a Canadian drummer working in a band in Vegas
- After a major car accident, he was sent back to Canada
- He was immobile and became a self-selective mute using only 'yes', 'no', and 'I'm cold' to communicate
- A music therapist asked us for a hi-hat
- A platform was built to support John's leg so that he could play
- John continued to get involved with the rhythm and beat it out with his foot
- Eventually John joined in as the music therapist sang
- Now, leg support is not needed, and John has full communication.
- Cost of hi-hat: \$50
- Sessions: Supported
- Quality of Life: Immeasurably Improved!
